

106 East Riverside Drive - Augusta, KY

Rosemary's house is located on the Ohio River in Augusta, Kentucky. The ferry from Higginsport,OH is located just a short distance from Rosemary's front steps.

From the West (Kentucky side of the Ohio River): I 275 East: Exit AA (9) Hwy South. Turn Left on KY 19 then Left on KY 8 and Right onto Main Street and Right onto Riverside Drive.

From the West (Ohio side of the Ohio River): Go East on US 52 to Ferry Landing at Higginsport and cross the Ohio River via the Ferry (\$5.00 per passenger car) and continue on Riverside Drive to 106.

From the North (Columbus area): I 71 South to I 471 West to I 275 West to Exit AA (9) Hwy. Turn Left on KY 19 then Left on KY 8 and Right onto Main Street and Right onto Riverside Drive or take US 52 directions above.

From the South (Lexington area): East on US 68 to the AA (9) Hwy to North on KY 19 then Left on KY 8 and Right onto Main Street and Right onto Riverside Drive.

From the East (Portsmouth area): US 52 West to Ripley. Go 10 miles West of Ripley and cross the Ohio River via the Ferry (\$5.00 per passenger car) and continue on Riverside Drive to 106.

Thanks to the efforts of **Dr. Steve Henry**, former Lt. Governor of Kentucky, and his wife **Heather French Henry**, Miss America 2000, Rosemary Clooney's historical Augusta, Kentucky home has been restored and is open to the public. The Henrys have invited visitors from around the



world to "Come On-A Rosie's House" where her legacy is preserved through an extensive collection of exhibits and displays dedicated to the legendary singer's life and career.

Having been born and raised in the same Kentucky towns as her mentor Rosemary Clooney, Heather was especially passionate about preserving Rosemary's home and creating a living tribute to Kentucky's favorite 'Girl Singer." The opportunity to give back to the communities that gave so much to both she and Rosemary was also a driving force in the Henrys' decision to turn Rosemary's home into a museum.

Rosemary called **106 Riverside Drive** her home for more than two decades. This "pleasing house," as she called it, was her centering place; her retreat from the demands of her career and a haven for rest and relaxation between performances that saw her traveling all over the world.
